THE LITTLE RED INFO BOX

The Parish Council have purchased the old BT Kiosk in South Road, Tetford for £1, following the decommissioning of the public telephone there. It is proposed that the kiosk is replaced with a traditional K6 red telephone box and the new facility acts as a small information centre. This could include such items such as a suggestion box for ideas/comments for the Parish Council, a village map, the ability to share books or additional seeds/plant cuttings, message board for local events for sale items or possible provision of dog poo bags – the list can go on. We have already obtained a small grant from ELDC but the overall project will cost an estimated £2,500. So, we are seeking residents support and any donations, pledges to bring this bit of British heritage to South Road

PROVISION OF AN ELECTRIC CAR CHARGING POINT AT HAMILTON HALL.

With the emphasis on a future greener environment the Parish Council propose looking into installing an electric car charging point at the village hall. To undertake this project also requires upgrading the halls' internet

connection and would therefore provide the opportunity for great flexibility when hiring the premises. Facilities for a community internet connection/café could be considered especially with the greater need for access to online services been made more apparent with the COVID 19 lockdown.

We would welcome your thoughts on this or any other projects along with ideas You may have for facilities within the village.

NeighboursFollowing on from the community repsonse to help those in need in the village during the Corona Virus outbreak the Parish Council is proposing to launch a general Good Neighbour Scheme, consisting of a network of volunteers who can offer help and support to their neighbours. The focus is to create a strong community spirit where neighbours help neighbours.
