NPT have been busy in the area, and assisting our colleagues on the coast.

During July, primary routes in the Horncastle Wragby areas targeted, resulting in 14 stops of which 4 reported for speed and one also for summons to court. In Skegness one of our team performed a Section 165, eScooter reported for no insurance, no driving license, and no vehicle registration. The rider had been previously stopped and informed of the legality of eScooter use in public areas. They choose to ignore this, and thus far it's cost the rider £150 recovery fee, plus £10 per day storage and a possible court

appearance, which may result in endorsed points and further monetary fines and costs, plus a driving ban.

PARKING ISSUES



Police are often asked to deal with nuisance parking. But did you know Lincolnshire County Council are responsible for parking.

Civil Enforcement Officers (CEO) employed by the council have their own powers to deal with parking issues. Including yellow line / parking bay infringements.

Police will deal with obstruction of the Highway or Footpath. i.e. where it is deemed to be a danger to other traffic, pedestrians, wheelchair access, dropped curb obstruction or access to other footfall areas.

Police **will not** deal with a legally entitled vehicle parked outside your home because you **'Do not like this / it's taking up a parking space / it's blocking my natural day light / now have to manoeuvre my vehicle a bit more to gain access to my driveway/ parking bay'**.

OPERATION ENCOMPASS

Operation Encompass is an innovative project that Lincolnshire Police are launching; it will help Lincolnshire schools to safeguard and support children who are experiencing domestic abuse.

Children and young people who witness or endure incidents of domestic abuse can be left frightened, confused and conflicted - they might directly witness the abuse, hear the abuse from another room, see injuries or distress in a loved one, or be physically hurt trying to stop the abuse. All of these scenarios can be incredibly distressing for a child.

Following such an incident, children will often arrive at school upset and unprepared. Where previously a school may not have been made aware of police attending a domestic abuse incident at the home, Operation Encompass will see that appropriately trained Safeguarding staff have this information so they can offer support and understanding to the child in the best possible way.

Assistant Chief Constable Kerrin Wilson said, "Domestic abuse has a ripple effect. Children within the household will suffer, sometimes to a devastating extent. Operation Encompass is a fantastic nationally recommended scheme, which we are pleased to launch with primary and secondary schools in Lincolnshire. It is another safeguarding route that we will use to ensure children are supported and we recognise that schools play a pivotal role in their student's ongoing wellbeing and safety."

How does Operation Encompass work?

After we receive a report of abuse from a home where children were present or usually reside, brief information will be shared with the school directly from Lincolnshire Police. This information will be handled by the school's Designated Safeguarding Lead. This ensures support can be provided as quickly as possible so the child involved can feel safe and listened to.

Each Designated Safeguarding Lead has been fully trained. They are able to ensure the right support is made available to the child following the disclosure of a domestic abuse incident.

By knowing that the child has had this experience, the school is in a better position to be supportive and understanding of the child's needs and possible behaviours.

OnePunchUK

As part of our ongoing work to reduce violent crime, Lincolnshire Police is working with registered charity OnePunchUK to raise awareness of the devastation that a one punch assault can have on the victim and their families.

OnePunchUK was founded by Maxine Thompson-Curl whose son Kristian was tragically killed following a one punch attack while on a night in Consett, County Durham.

Kristian, aged 19, was in a coma for more than a week and survived for 10 months but died in 2011.

Following her son's tragic death, Maxine has been raising awareness about the dangers of one punch attacks through her campaign Punched Out Cold Campaign working alongside the police.
